COURSE DESCRIPTION

0820-502: Psychological and Social Foundations of Education CR: 3

This course focuses on the basic theories of learning and teaching and the application of theory to educational environments. It intends to foster an understanding of how psychology and education are interrelated. It also aims to equip Student teachers with insights into student behavior and learning. Major concepts include the principles of motivation, classroom management, learning theories, contemporary teaching strategies, and contemporary issues in education the social, cultural, and political factors that influence learning.

0820-521: Islamic Educational Thought CR: 3

Factors influencing Islamic educational thought. The philosophical and social framework of Islamic educational thought. Trends and characteristics of Islamic educational thought. The institutions of the Islamic society. Scientists of Islamic educational thought. A critical and analytical view on some doctrines and positivist orientations.

0820-522: Philosophy of Education CR: 3 PR: 0820-521

The shape and nature of the relationship between philosophy and education - the inevitable and logical extent of the relation between education and philosophy. Different approaches in philosophizing in education within its historical and philosophical frameworks.

Issues and domains of research in the field of philosophy of education. The achievement of the main philosophical objective: "the logical clarification "of ideas. The development of a project related to a philosophical and educational vision that can guide the educational issues in the Arab world.

0820-524: Contemporary Trends in Education CR: 3

Definition of sociology of education, its genesis, its development, the relationship of sociology with education-the science of Sociology of education-the problem of inequality in modern societiescharacteristics of contemporary society-the curriculum in educational sociology-the official approach and the hidden approach: concept and methods of its discovery - development and the pioneering role of ideology and its relationship with education- social mobility: its concept, its evolution, its application to the Kuwaiti, Gulf and Arab Society- contemporary trends in understanding the educational problems studied, such as inequality and the role of ideology in this new understanding (monetary trend)

The role of development processes in developing a critical approach and directing it to the so-called postmodernism.

0820-525: Comparative Education CR: 3

Introduction to comparative education-factors in the structure of educational systems-study of different educational systems in societies with different degrees of economic progress-study of educational systems in developed countries-study of educational systems in under- developed countries with the aim of identifying educational problems in all of them and to determine their characteristics and understanding the close relationship between social, economic, political and cultural systems.... etc. and its established educational systems.

0820-526: Adult Education CR: 3

The concept of adult education and its dimensions. The nature of adult education and its characteristics—The adult education goals. Adult education between literacy and continuous education-the relationship between the process of global development and

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adult education-issues and problems facing adult education-recent trends in adult education-planning for adult education.

0820-531: Prospectus in Education CR: 3 PR: 0820-524

This course addresses the dimensions of strategic planning and its concepts, as well as the foundations of deriving rules and laws governing the future in the field of education, and the trends of employing new developments in shaping the future, and it also includes analysis of some futuristic studies.

0820-549: Education and Development CR: 3

This course discusses the theories of development and the strategies based on them and the decisions related to the implementation and the role of education and the modification of the pathways of the national economy, and f it also focuses on the directives of the post-oil era in modifying the educational pathways in the State of Kuwait - it also highlights the investments in education and projects related to the model of development in the field of education.

0820-593: Project CR: 3

The student undertakes an independent project on a research topic of theoretical and/or experimental focus under the supervision of a faculty member listed in the supervisory list of the College of Graduate Studies. The objective is to provide the student with an opportunity to integrate and apply the knowledge gained throughout the course of study in a practical problem. The student must document the project in a scientific report following standard research writing guidelines and give a public presentation to the project examination committee.
